Martin Felderer (* 25 Jan 1796 – † 1 May 1868)

2. Places: Stams, St. Peter (Gratsch, South Tirol) and Mais (South Tirol)

3. Biography: Born in Innsbruck, he entered Stams Abbey on 18 Oct 1818 and made profession in 1821. In 1826 he began as a chaplain in Mais parish, becoming pastor there in 1839. He continued his work there until his death. He was said to have been an especially generous and wise man, beloved by students. Many people came to him seeking advice. He often gave money and other gifts to those in need. Sources note his calm and composed nature.
