Joseph-Louis Girod († 11 Oct 1795)

2. Places: Limoges, Tulle, Rochefort, Brouage (Hiers-Brouage)

3. Biography: J.-L. is one of 13 Rochefort martyrs listed in the DCS. The others are Philip Brandel, François-Xavier Brunel, Paul Charles, Onuphrius Clavier, Elias Desgardins, Stephen d'Huberte, Macarius d'Incamps, Michael-Joseph Dujonquoi, Matthew Gachet, René Leroy, Florentinus Maillet, and Eligius Richy. J.-L. was a monk of the Feuillant Limoges Abbey. He was arrested in 1793 and imprisoned in Tulle, then deported to the prison ship *Le Gentil* on 24 Nov 1794. The transfer to Brouage (now Hiers-Brouage) took place on 26 Apr 1795. He died there after five months. For more background information, see Francis-Xavier Brunel.
