Máel Ísa (Malchus) of Mellifont († c. 1186)

- 1. Name variants: Máel Ísa, Malchus (baptismal), Connery, Ó Con Áirge, O'Conarchy, Ua Conairche, Ua Condoirche, Ua Connairche (family)
- 2. Places: Bangor, Mellifont
- 3. Biography: M. was a monk of Bangor, student of Malachy Ua Morgair, and reputed brother of Gilla Críst of Lismore, the Gaelic Irish Cistercian abbot of Mellifont and bishop of Lismore. M. appears twice in Bernard of Clairvaux's vita of Malachy. It is Bernard who identified M. as a blood brother of Gilla Críst, yet closer still in spirit. Some modern authors claim that M. became a monk of Mellifont and succeeded his brother as abbot when Gilla Críst was elected bishop of Lismore, c. 1151. However, the surviving succession lists for Mellifont make no mention of M. It has been held that M. died at Mellifont. A date of c. 1186, the same as that of his brother, is sometimes suggested for his death, but it is not certain.
