## Stephen († 18 Jul 1185)

1. Name variants: S. of Alvastra, S. of Uppsala

2. Places: Clairvaux, Alvastra, Uppsala, Sens

3. Biography: S., who may have been English, was probably among the Clairvaux monks who left in 1143 to found the monastery of Alvastra. In 1164 S. went to Sens and met with Pope Alexander III. He also met with Eskil, archbishop of Lund. For several years there had been a discussion about giving Sweden an archbishop, and the decision was now made. S. had probably already been bishop elect of Uppsala. He was buried in the chapter room in Alvastra Abbey.
