Walter Daniel (12th c.)

- 1. Name variants: Master Walter, Magister Walterus, Walterus Rievallensis
- 2. Places: Rievaulx
- 3. Biography: W. was a monk and theologian of Rievaulx from 1150 until his death, having followed the example of his father Daniel, who joined Rievaulx by 1147. The date and place of W.'s birth are unknown. Before entering Rievaulx, he had been educated, possibly at Durham or York. He later described himself as a medicus, perhaps referencing his work as infirmarian of Rievaulx. He is best known as the helper and then biographer of his abbot, Aelred of Rievaulx. He is named as a participant in the dialogue 'De spirituali amicitia'. W.'s Vita Aelredi is a classic of Cistercian literature; it reveals its author's capacity of friendship and his full devotion to Cistercian life. The later medieval vitae of Aelred are ultimately conflations of W.'s works. An effective rhetorician, W. was the most prolific writer of Rievaulx besides Aelred. The antiquarian John Leland (†1552) recorded an additional nine works, all theological, by W., then held in the library of Rievaulx. Apart from his Vita Aelredi, only his 'Centum sententiae' and four sermons survived. His memory was deeply respected at Rievaulx. John Bale († 1563) reported that W. died and was buried at Rievaulx.
