Clémentine Görris (* 5 May 1859 – † 4 Jun 1886)

3. Biography: Maria Görris was born in Amsterdam. On 9 Dec 1882, she began her novitiate in the Trappistine Abbey in Oelenberg as Sr. Clémentine. The young choir nun was imbued with the desire to give herself to God as a total sacrifice of love. Her zeal and faithfulness in religious life were considered extraordinary. Shortly after her simple profession on 26 May 1885, C. was struck by a serious illness to which she would soon succumb. She made her solemn profession on her deathbed. As she herself had predicted, she died on a First Friday at 3 p.m.
