## **Konrad II of Salzburg** (\* c. 1115 – † 28 Sep 1168)

1. Names: Konrad of Babenberg, Konrad I of Passau

2. Places: Klosterneuburg, Passau, Salzburg, Friesach, Admont

3. Biography: K. was the son of Leopold III, Margrave of Austria, and born in Klosterneuburg. The hypothesis that he was abbot of Heiligenkreuz (HENRIQUEZ 1731, 148) cannot be confirmed. From 1148 on, he served as bishop of Passau. In 1164, he was elected archbishop of Salzburg. As a result of his support for Pope Alexander III and not the antipope Paschalis III, Emperor Barbarossa refused to grant him the regalia. After several failed attempts at rapprochement, the emperor imposed the imperial ban on the archbishopric in 1166. K. had to leave Salzburg and tried to continue his official duties from Friesach, later from Admont. There he died.
